Corrections Report 2, Juvenile Justice Center Meeting Report

Subject: Singleness of Purpose

Meetings inside JJD begin, "Hello. My name's _____. I'm an alcoholic." After the Serenity Prayer, first name introductions, and the reading of the Preamble by one of the young men and women there, the question is usually asked "What do you think an alcoholic is?"

After some discussion we turn to the Big Book. Paraphrasing The Doctor's Opinion: 'when a chronic alcoholic takes a drink, he experiences a physical craving for alcohol that never occurs in the average temperate drinker. Once having formed his habit, when he takes a drink, he continues drinking to overcome a craving beyond his mental control. And chronic alcoholic means: "Once an alcoholic, always an alcoholic.""

If an alcoholic decides he wants what we have and is willing to go to any length to be free from his deadly, merciless obsession to drink, then he is "ready to take certain steps." If he takes these steps and practices these principles in all his affairs, he may tap "an unsuspected inner resource." He may identify this new inner resource with his own conception of a Power greater than himself which will solve his problem.

Usually, five or six young men and women attend each meeting. To the best of my knowledge they are wither asked or invited by staff to attend. Usually one or more are not alcoholic, but most are knowledgeable and readily state whether they are alcoholics or not and if they have any other addictions.

The Preamble states our primary purpose and it seems clear to them. I personally believe that excluding any of these young men and women from a message of hope and love who don't have a choice of messages to hear on any particular day would be shameful. Several of them share that outside JJC they attend a fellowship appropriate for their addictions. Some are dually addicted.

I personally believe that AA's Singleness of Purpose is being upheld and respected by all in attendance at JJC. When we discuss steps, two, three, and four, there are no differences among us.
